

Florida has a way of testing every part of a home. Roofs bake under long stretches of sun, afternoon storms roll in fast, and the kind of heavy rain that looks dramatic from the porch can quietly punish a gutter system in less than an hour. In Crawfordsville, that matters more than many homeowners realize. Gutters are not decorative trim. Humidity adds another wrinkle. Damp organic debris does not just sit there. It breaks down, smells musty, and attracts insects. Mosquitoes do not need much standing water to use a clogged gutter as a breeding area. Ants and roaches can also take advantage of the moisture and shelter around packed debris. If trees overhang the roofline, the cycle becomes even more constant because fresh material drops in before the old buildup ever fully dries out.

gutter tight enough that it keeps its pitch when it fills during rain. If there is black streaking on the face of the gutter or overflow marks below the seams, those are signs worth noticing.

Some warning signs are obvious, but others are easy to dismiss until damage spreads. Overflow in a storm is the classic one. Staining on siding is another clue. When water repeatedly spills over or behind the gutter, it leaves marks. Peeling paint near roof edges often points to chronic moisture exposure.
