Mil-Spec (Dark Blue) 15.98% Common drops, a little greater value than blues.
Limited (Purple) 3.20% Uncommon items, frequently the budget-friendly favorites.
Categorized (Pink) 0.64% Rare products; usually high-tier weapon surfaces.
Covert (Red) 0.16% Extremely unusual; flagship weapon skins for the case.
Unique Item (Gold) 0.26% The prize tier, including knives or gloves.

Note: There is approximately a 10% opportunity for any dropped item to feature the StatTrak™ technology, which cuts the base chances of that particular item in half once again.

Float Values and Wear Conditions

Landing a rare red or gold skin is only half the fight. When an item is won, its visual quality is figured out by its **Float Value**-- a number between 0.00 and 1.00 that determines wear and tear.

Gamers must acquaint themselves with the five main wear categories:

1. **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, minimal scratches)
2. **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight blemishes or use on edges)
3. **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable scratches and dullness)

4. **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear and texture loss)

5. **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Extremely used, often significantly modifying the skin's appearance)

Some skins really look better or maintain their value well in Field-Tested condition, while others plummet in price if they aren't Factory New.

The Economics: Opening Cases vs. Buying Singles

From a simply financial viewpoint, opening CS2 cases is often a losing proposition. Due to the fact that the anticipated worth (EV) of a case is lower than the combined expense of the case and the secret, your house (Valve) constantly wins in the long run.
