

Finding a hidden septic tank can feel like a witch hunt, other than the reward is a concrete lid and the stakes are a great deal greater. If you need to pump the tank, examine a baffle, replace a riser, or pull a filter, you need to understand exactly where that storage tank sits. 1. Identify one of the most likely sewer leave point from the house and mark a search corridor extending outward.
2. Probe carefully every 18 to 24 inches, pressing straight down and keeping in mind deepness and resistance at each spot.
3. When you feel a wide difficult quit, probe around it in numerous directions to describe the edges.
4. Look for a rectangle-shaped impact, typically several feet large and a number of feet long, rather than a single isolated tough point.
