- **Enable Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator:** This is non-negotiable. Without it, trading and offering on the market are heavily limited, and accounts are vulnerable to hackers.

- **Blue Skins (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.98% possibility

- **Purple Skins (Restricted):** ~ 15.98% opportunity
- **Pink Skins (Classified):** ~ 3.2% opportunity
- **Red Skins (Covert):** ~ 0.64% opportunity
- **Unique Rare Item (Knives/Gloves):** ~ 0.26% opportunity

1. **Set a Budget:** Treat case opening like home entertainment (like going to a gambling establishment), not as an investment method.
