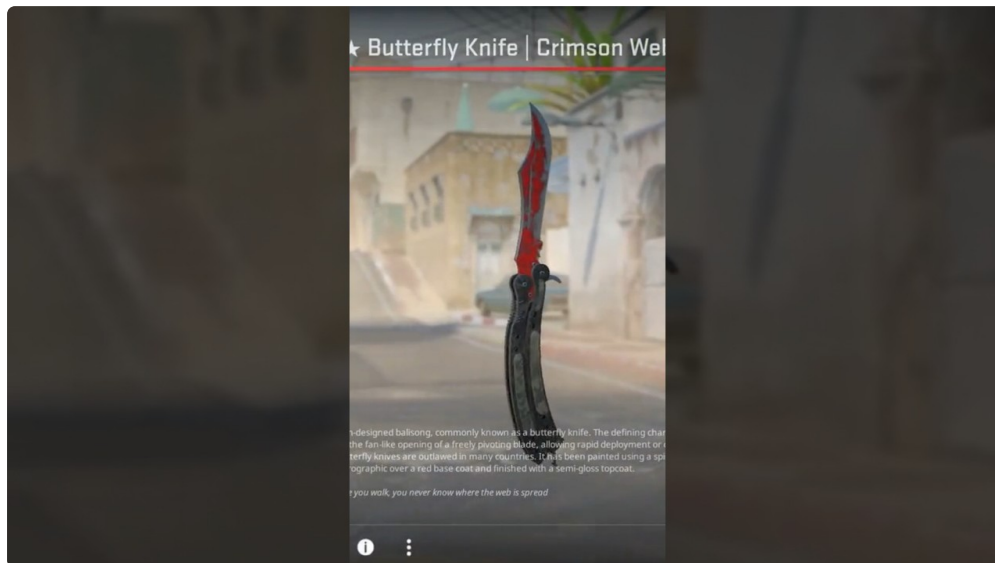

* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the opportunity that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) product, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak version of a high-tier skin. The specific probability for each specific skin within that tier is a different, concealed calculation.

The table shows that while most cases cost just a couple of dollars, the likelihood of landing a high-value skin remains really low. Players must therefore see case opening as a type of home entertainment instead of a reputable financial investment.
