4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, several gamers toss skins into a main pot. Each skin adds to the gamer's total percentage chance of winning the entire pot (based upon the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner selects a winning ticket, and one fortunate player takes home all the deposited skins.

- **Never ever gamble more than you can afford to lose:** Treat skins as entertainment expenditures instead of financial investments or dependable sources of income.
