What Does Your System's Refrigerant Type Tell You About Replacement Timing?

Your refrigerant type is the most revealing indicator of whether replacement makes sense. If your system runs on R-22, replacement is no longer optional—it's mandatory for legal operation in Sacramento. R-22 is fully phased out, and obtaining it illegally is expensive and violates EPA Section 608 certification requirements. Systems using R-410A still work today, but with production ending in 2025, recovery and recharging costs climb sharply each year, making retrofit or replacement the practical choice within the next few years.

R-410A systems installed between 2010 and 2023 are caught in a transition period. The refrigerant itself is still legal and available, but supply is tightening and cost per pound has doubled in the past three years. If your unit develops a refrigerant leak, recharging it today costs significantly more than it did five years ago. By 2026, when EPA stockpiles deplete further, a single leak repair could cost \$1,500 or more in refrigerant alone.

This shift changes the repair-versus-replace calculus. A 12-year-old R-410A system with a refrigerant leak might have been worth fixing in 2020, but today it often makes financial sense to replace it with a new R-454B unit that uses the EPA-approved next-generation refrigerant.
