Coinflip	A simple 1v1 PvP video game where 2 players wager skins of roughly equivalent value. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 odds, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Prize	Multiple gamers contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's value identifies the player's "ticket" share. A spinner picks one winner who takes everything. Based on the overall value contributed; platform takes a percentage fee.
