Comprehending Wear Ratings (Float Values)

No two skins are entirely identical, thanks to the Float Value system. A float value is a decimal number in between **0.00 and 1.00** that identifies how used or battle-scarred a skin looks.

Wear Category	Float Value Range	Visual Characteristics
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful, very little to no scratches or blemishes.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Extremely small wear, typically near the edges or high-friction locations.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Noticeable scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most typical category.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, heavy scratching, and noticeable paint loss.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Badly weathered, sometimes entirely modifying the weapon's look.

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).

StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Gamers can also obtain special variations of skins:

- **StatTrak™**: Features an LCD counter embedded in the weapon that tracks the number of eliminates made with that particular item.
- **Memento**: Dropped solely throughout main Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), including gold stickers of the groups and MVP of the round.

The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost A Lot?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is greatly driven by supply and demand. Due to the fact that skins are gotten mostly through random drops, opening weapon cases with keys, or trading, uncommon products command staggering prices. Some legendary knives and rare-patterned rifles have actually cost numerous countless dollars.

A number of elements determine the worth of a CS2 skin:

1. **Rarity Tier:** Consumer (White), Industrial (Light Blue), Mil-Spec (Dark Blue), Restricted (Purple), Classified (Pink), Covert (Red), and Exceedingly Rare (Gold/Knives and Gloves).

4. **Discontinuation:** Skins from old operations or eliminated cases can no longer drop organically, diminishing the supply while need remains stable.

- **Enable Steam Guard:** Always utilize two-factor authentication (Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator) to protect your account.
- **Double-check trade URLs:** When trading with others, ensure you are trading with the actual user and not an impersonator account with a similar name and avatar.
