What Makes a CS: GO Skin Rare?

4. **Discontinuation:** When Valve eliminates a case from active drop swimming pools or discontinues a collection, the supply ends up being finite, triggering rates to rise as demand continues.
5. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Tournament keepsakes and weapons decorated with unusual, discontinued sticker labels (like Katowice 2014 holo stickers) can increase a skin's baseline worth tremendously.

The Holy Grails: Most Legendary Rare CS: GO Skins

Certain skins have actually transcended the game to end up being digital folklore. Below are some of the rarest and most costly skins in CS: GO history.

1. AWP|Dragon Lore (Souvenir)

Undoubtedly the most well-known skin in the game, the Dragon Lore features a legendary monster breathing fire throughout its body. While standard Factory New variations command huge amounts, the **Souvenir Factory New Dragon Lore** from significant tournaments (especially signed by players like Tyler "Skadoodle" Latham from Boston 2018) are ultra-rare.

- **Estimated Value:** £ 150,000+

2. StatTrak™ M4A4|Wail (Factory New)

The Howl is distinct because it is the just "Contraband" quality product in the game. Shortly after its release in 2014, Valve discovered that the art work was plagiarized. Valve right away removed the case, changed the artwork, and updated the existing M4 Howls to "Contraband" status, halting any new drops forever.

- **Estimated Value:** £ 30,000 to £ 100,000+ (depending on stickers and wear)

3. AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 - "The Blue Gem")

While the Case Hardened finish is typical, certain pattern design templates feature nearly 100% strong blue on the leading publication and receiver. Pattern index 661 in Factory New condition is widely considered the supreme AK-47 skin.

- **Approximated Value:** Estimated to be worth upwards of £ 400,000 to £ 500,000 based on recent personal collector deals.

4. Karambit|Case Hardened (Blue Gem - Pattern 387)

Similar to the AK-47, the Karambit Case Hardened with pattern index 387 includes a totally blue playside. A pristine Factory New version of this knife is held by a single collector who famously turned down a EUR1.2 million offer.

- **Estimated Value:** Priceless/ Over £ 1,000,000
