- Understand that case battles magnify variation. You will experience massive winning streaks and agonizing losing streaks.

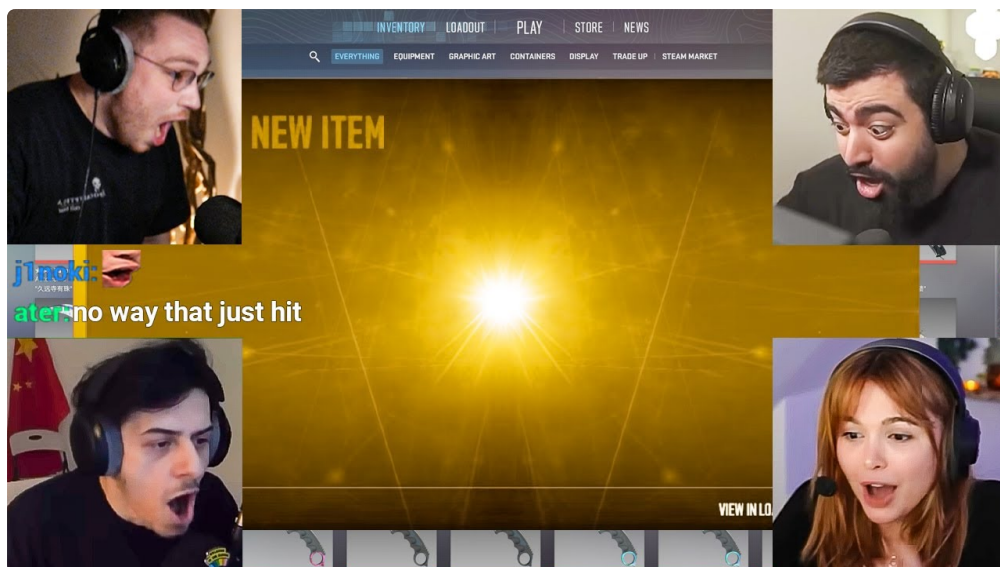
3. Start with Low-Cost Battles
