- **Jackpot:** Multiple players pool their skins into a single pot. The greater the value of a player's skins, the greater their statistical chance of winning the whole pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on professional CS2 matches (such as BLAST, ESL Pro League, and Majors) utilizing skins, crypto, or cash.

### 2. Security and Licensing
