- **eSports 2013 Case**-- Released for the 2013 ESL One Katowice tournament. Just a few thousand were granted, and it never returned.
- **eSports 2014 Summer Case**-- Issued during the 2014 Summer Majors. Its drop rate was very minimal, and it has since become a staple of high-end inventories.

- **Winter Case (2013)**-- Distributed during the 2013 Winter Holiday occasion. The case is understood for its unique blue-toned artwork and uncommon skin swimming pool.
- **Operation Bravo Case**-- Introduced with Operation Bravo (2013). Although the operation itself is long gone, the case remains obtainable just through the Steam Community Market.

- **Chroma 2 Case**-- Though still technically obtainable, its original drop rate was lower than the majority of, and it is considered "rare" by many traders.
