Bet Type Payment Ratio Description **Basic Win** 1:1 (Even Money) Beating the dealership's total without a blackjack. **Natural Blackjack** 3:2 (or sometimes 6:5) Achieving an Ace and a 10-value card on the preliminary offer. **Insurance Bet** 2:1 Bet positioned when the dealer's upcard is an Ace, guaranteeing against dealer blackjack.

Pro Tip: Always look for live blackjack tables that pay **3:2 for a natural blackjack** instead of **6:5**, as the 3:2 payout significantly lowers your house edge.

Common Side Bets in Live Blackjack

- **Understand "Bet Behind" Features:** If a live table is full, many companies use a "Bet Behind" choice. This enables a gamer to wager on the hand of a seated player. Know that the seated gamer makes all the gameplay decisions for that hand.
