- **Cease-and-Desist Letters:** Valve has regularly targeted popular gambling operators with legal cautions, forcing lots of prominent sites to shut down or modify their business models.
- **Account Bans:** Valve routinely bans trade bots and individual accounts associated with commercial gambling operations.

In spite of these efforts, the industry adapts. Sites have actually shifted towards accepting cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) or alternative payment processors alongside-- or completely in location of-- direct skin

trading, permitting them to circumvent Steam's restrictions.
