

16x8 garage door maintenance: Frequent Problems

A 16 ft x 8 ft garage door is a popular size for a two-car garage, but its wider span creates substantial weight and mechanical stress. Whether you have an aging overhead garage door or a recent automatic garage door, worn components can affect operation, security, and safety.

Frequent warning signs include a noisy garage door, a door that will not open, a door that comes down quickly, or an uneven garage door that appears crooked in the opening. Homeowners may also notice a bent track, a frayed lift cable, damaged rollers, or gaps around the weather seal.

A sectional garage door is made of linked horizontal sections. If one section is struck by a vehicle or damaged by wind, the garage door panel may bend, crack, or pull away from its hinges. A problem with the garage door opener can also prevent the door from moving even when the panels, springs, and garage door tracks appear intact.

Before replacing the opener, a technician should confirm that the door itself is balanced and can move manually. An opener cannot safely overcome a binding door or a broken spring.

Do not base the decision on appearance alone. A door that looks fine may have worn garage door cables, weakened spring hardware, loose fasteners, or deteriorated end bearings. Conversely, a dented panel may be fixable if the operating system remains properly aligned.

Garage door protection begins with understanding that springs and cables store substantial energy. Do not take out a torsion spring, detach spring hardware, sever worn cables, or attempt to straighten a heavily bent track

without professional equipment and training.

- Keep children and pets away from the moving door and garage door tracks.
- Do not use the door if a spring is broken, a cable is loose, or the door is visibly crooked.
- Test the photo-eye sensors by putting an appropriate object in the opening and verifying that the door reverses according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Keep the sensor lenses free of debris and aligned, and never disable the automatic reversal system.
- Learn how to use the emergency release or manual release only when the door is completely shut or properly supported.
- Do not pull the emergency release while a heavy door is open if the springs or cables appear damaged.
- Keep the remote control out of reach of children and replace weak batteries promptly.

If the door will not open, avoid continually using the garage door opener. If the door drops rapidly, stop using it immediately. Worn cables, damaged springs, and a failed opener can create a major hazard. Schedule a garage door safety inspection with a qualified professional instead of attempting a high-tension repair.
