4. Significant Tournaments and View Passes

Throughout Valve-sponsored CS2 Major champions, [cs2 case opening](#) audiences can purchase or in some cases earn Souvenir Packages.

- By enjoying the tournament live through the Steam TV or in-game customer, or by participating in the Pick 'Em Challenge utilizing a Viewer Pass, gamers can earn Souvenir Cases specific to that competition.
- These cases do not need a crucial to open, making them 100% free worth once got.

Alternative Methods: External Sites (Proceed with Caution)
