- By viewing the tournament live through the Steam television or in-game customer, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge utilizing a Viewer Pass, gamers can make Souvenir Cases specific to that tournament.
- These cases do not require a crucial to open, making them 100% free value once obtained.
