Game Type	Description	Home Edge/ Mechanics

Roulette	Traditional live roulette adjusted for CS2, frequently featuring 3 colors (red, black, green) with varying payment multipliers. Requirement casino chances, normally preferring your house via the green zero/logo.	
Case Opening	Imitates the in-game case opening experience with custom chances and possibly greater return rates than main Valve cases. Purely luck-based; odds are determined by the platform.	
Coinflip	A 1v1 video game where two gamers wager skins of equivalent worth on a virtual coin toss. Winner takes all (minus a website commission). 50/50 chances, subject to a platform rake (fee).	
Prize	Multiple gamers contribute skins to a common swimming pool. The higher the worth contributed, the greater the possibility of winning the entire pot. Probability-based based upon relative skin worth.

- **Client Support:** Reliable 24/7 live chat support is necessary for dealing with deposit failures, trade hold issues, or account inquiries immediately.

Risks Associated with CS2 Gambling
