We pulled the cover to find solids deep near the outlet. The filter was a felt-like mat. We pumped, cleaned, and attempted to save the field

with resting cycles, however fines had actually currently moved. The repair quote came back at 14,200 dollars for a mound system due to site restrictions. A pair of 400 dollar pumpings during those eight years would have been money well spent.

Another owner had clay soil, a small lot, and a shallow water level. The field was at completion of its style life and backups had actually started.
