

Bayport has a way of surprising people. On paper, it can look like one of many coastal hamlets along Long Island's South Shore, the kind of place you drive through on the way to somewhere else. Spend a little time here, though, and the character of the village settles in quickly. Bayport feels lived-in, layered, and unusually grounded.
