1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most well-known skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore includes a mythical dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped specifically on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout major competitions, these keepsake bundles are now extremely uncommon. A Factory New Souvenir

Dragon Lore signed by superstar player Skadoodle notoriously sold for over £ 60,000 years earlier, and costs have actually only intensified considering that.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is fairly economical, the top-tier pattern indices-- particularly Pattern 661-- cover practically the whole leading receiver of the weapon in a beautiful, reflective blue. Due to the fact that the chances of unpacking this exact pattern with a great float worth are astronomically low, these items have commanded personal deals exceeding 6 figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Howl

The Howl is special because it holds historical significance. Valve removed the original artwork due to a copyright infringement claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve updated the style and stopped it from dropping entirely. Anybody holding a Howl at that time kept it, producing a completely capped supply.
