

A broken garage door can affect entry, security, and the well-being of your home. Whether your garage door will not open, closes irregularly, or makes a noticeable grinding sound, prompt garage door repair can keep a minor issue from becoming a serious failure.

If the wall switch works but the remote does not, the issue may involve the remote, its programming, or the opener receiver.

Photo-eye sensors are another regular source of trouble. These small sensors sit near the floor on both sides of the garage door. If they are dirty, misaligned, blocked, or damaged, the opener may not close the door or may reverse immediately. Gently clean the lenses and confirm that both sensor indicator lights are visible. Do not bypass the sensors, because they are an important safety feature.

Track alignment can also prevent proper operation. A bent track, loose bracket, or obstruction may cause the door to bind. If the motor runs but the door does not move, the drive gear, trolley, spring, or lifting cable may require expert evaluation. Avoid repeatedly pressing the opener, since continued operation can worsen motor damage or worsen a mechanical problem.

Why Is My Garage Door Noisy, Crooked, or Stuck?

A noisy garage door may have under-lubricated hinges, worn rollers, loose fasteners, or a problem with the garage door tracks. Squealing, rattling, grinding, and popping sounds should not be ignored.
