Understanding Wear Ratings (Float Values)

No two skins are entirely similar, thanks to the Float Value system. A float worth is a decimal number in between **0.00 and 1.00** that determines how used or battle-scarred a skin looks.

Wear Category Drift Value Range Visual Characteristics
Factory New (FN) 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, minimal to no scratches or imperfections.
Minimal Wear (MW) 0.07-- 0.15 Extremely small wear, generally near the edges or high-friction locations.
Field-Tested (FT) 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most common category.
Well-Worn (WW) 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and visible paint loss.
Battle-Scarred (BS) 0.45-- 1.00 Significantly weathered, often entirely modifying the weapon's appearance.

Note: Some skins are "capped," suggesting they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).



StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Players can also obtain unique variations of skins:

- **StatTrak™:** Features an LCD counter embedded in the weapon that tracks the variety of eliminates made with that particular product.
- **Memento:** Dropped solely during main Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), including gold sticker labels of the teams and MVP of the round.

The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost A Lot?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is greatly driven by supply and demand. Due to the fact that skins are obtained primarily through random drops, opening weapon cases with secrets, or trading, uncommon items command incredible costs. Some legendary knives and rare-patterned rifles have cost numerous thousands of dollars.

Several elements dictate the worth of a CS2 skin:

1. **Rarity Tier:** Consumer (White), Industrial (Light Blue), Mil-Spec (Dark Blue), Restricted (Purple), Classified (Pink), Covert (Red), and Exceedingly Rare (Gold/Knives and Gloves).
2. **Float and Pattern Indexes:** Certain patterns (like the "Blue Gem" Case Hardened knife or the "Low Float" Crimson Web) are remarkably uncommon and valued by collectors.
3. **Pro Player Popularity:** If a popular esports expert uses a particular skin throughout a Major, its need often surges.
4. **Discontinuation:** Skins from old operations or eliminated cases can no longer drop organically, diminishing the supply while demand remains stable.

- **Steam Community Market:** The best and most uncomplicated way to buy and sell common-to-rare skins using Steam Wallet funds.
- **Third-Party Marketplaces:** For severe traders and collectors, third-party sites enable users to buy skins utilizing real-world currency or money out their inventory balance. (Always utilize credible, community-vetted platforms to prevent rip-offs).

Finest Practices for Trading and Collecting Safely

Because CS2 skins hold genuine financial worth, the community sadly draws in bad stars, scammers, and phishers. Safeguard your digital properties by following these essential guidelines:

- **Never click random links:** Scammers often impersonate traders, tournament organizers, or assistance personnel, sending out malicious phishing links designed to take Steam credentials.
- **Keep your API Key private:** Never share your Steam API secret with any third-party trading site.
- **Enable Steam Guard:** Always use two-factor authentication (Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator) to secure your account.
- **Double-check trade URLs:** When trading with others, ensure you are trading with the real user and not an impersonator account with a similar name and avatar.
