### Fixing Methods: Quick vs. Advanced Fixes

## Stage 3: Managing Background Applications and Overlays

Overlays can severely impact game stability. Gamers need to disable the following features if they experience frequent crashes:

- Steam Overlay (Disable globally in Steam Settings > >
- In-Game )Discord Overlay NVIDIA GeForce Experience In-Game Overlay
- Third-party MSI Afterburner or RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS) OSD displays

## Comparing Crash Types and Solutions

## Advanced Solutions for Persistent Crashes

If standard troubleshooting fails, players may require to examine deeper system configurations.

### 1. Changing Launch Options

Release options enable gamers to require the game to start under particular parameters, which can bypass initialization bugs.

- Open Steam Library > > Right-click CS: GO > > Properties > General.

- In the **Launch Options** field, try adding:
  - -autoconfig (Resets video and performance settings to default)
  - -nod3d9ex (Disables an older DirectX extension that sometimes triggers conflicts)
  - -threads [number] (Forces the game to use a particular number of CPU cores)

## 2. Monitoring Hardware Temperatures and Overclocks

Pushing hardware beyond factory limits through overclocking (CPU, GPU, or RAM) can cause instability in requiring source-engine games.

- Use tracking software like HWMonitor or MSI Afterburner to examine temperature levels while playing.
- If temperatures surpass 85 ° C, tidy out dust filters and guarantee correct airflow.
- Momentarily revert any factory overclocks or XMP profiles to check if system stability improves.

## 3. Reinstalling Visual C++ and DirectX

Lots of game crashes occur because the Windows operating system does not have the required runtime libraries required to carry out game scripts.

- Navigate to the video game's setup folder: Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ \_CommonRedist
- Run the installers situated inside the vcredist and DirectX folders to repair or upgrade vital system files.

## Preventative Measures for a Stable Gaming Experience

Avoiding future crashes is often easier than identifying them after the fact. Embracing a couple of routine upkeep routines can keep a video gaming rig running smoothly:

- **Keep Windows Updated:** Ensure the operating system has the current cumulative security and efficiency updates installed.
- **Regularly Clean Storage Drives:** Ensure the drive hosting the game has at least 15% free space to permit proper pagefile management and virtual memory allotment.
- **Carry Out Clean Driver Installations:** When performing significant GPU chauffeur updates, utilize a tool like Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU) in Safe Mode to wipe old chauffeur remnants totally before installing the brand-new variation.
