Keep in mind: Max payout refers to the highest multiplier a player can receive per round. Some platforms impose an everyday or per-bet cap.

Techniques and Risk Management

1. Fixed-Percentage Bankroll Method

- **Step 1:** Determine an overall bankroll (the quantity of funds devoted to CS: GO Crash).
