When completed wisely, you take care of the herbal texture and sheen of the surface. On a honed marble, the end stays matte. On polished granite, it stays crisp and reflective.

Not each stone needs the same attention

Dark, fantastic-dense granites like absolute black mainly repel penetrating sealers. If you follow a conventional impregnator to them, you possibly can fight streaks. In those instances, I run the water try first. If water beads for 15 mins devoid of darkening, I skip sealing or observe a micro-thin coat of a product specially meant for dense stone and buff aggressively. Less is greater.



Leathered finishes bring together residue in their texture if you happen to flood the sealer and stroll away. Work the product in lightly, let it stay, then pass returned over the subject with a mushy towel wrapped over a rubber grout float to press into the texture and pull out extra.

Sinks, seams, and splash zones
