

A cracked windshield has a way of turning an ordinary drive into a small expedition. One minute you are rolling down Market Street, I-40, or a back road outside Greensboro with coffee in the cup holder. The next, a stone snaps off a truck tire and leaves a starburst in the glass right in your line of sight. You lean forward. You squint. You start searching for “cheap windshield replacement near me” before the engine cools.

That search makes sense. Nobody wakes up eager to spend money on auto glass. When repair beats replacement

Not every chip means you need a front windshield replacement. There is also timing. I have seen drivers put clear tape over a chip to keep dirt out while they schedule service. What a fair windshield replacement cost should include

3. Ask about safe drive-away time and weather limitations for mobile service.

5. Get warranty terms in plain language, especially for leaks, wind noise, and workmanship.

ADAS calibration is where cheap can get expensive
