4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, several gamers toss skins into a central pot. Each skin contributes to the player's general portion opportunity of winning the whole pot (based on the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner selects a winning ticket, and one fortunate player takes home all the deposited skins.
