Applications develop into friends, cohorts turn into training phases, and phases become graduates. AELO Swiss Academy, based in Locarno at the airport area, is a great study for exactly how that system can be checked out from a couple of public signals.

From the reporting around AELO's step and rebrand, we know a couple of concrete anchors. AELO is the rebranded follower to Aero Locarno.
