The second diagnostic stage examines whether mineral deposits or sediment inside the tank have triggered failure. Los Angeles County hard water means calcium buildup accelerates over time. A technician trained in replacement decision workflow will flush the tank and measure sediment depth. If sediment exceeds a quarter-inch and water heater age exceeds 10 years, flushing costs \$200–\$300 but buying time only lasts 6–12 months. This knowledge changes the pricing conversation entirely.
