

The case for not doing it yourself

The job looks easy [permanent holiday lights](#) from the ground, then it eats a whole weekend. Between the ladder, the cold, and the strand that dies the day after you finish, hiring it out stops feeling like a luxury.

What a real installation service includes

The job has four parts, and the last two are the ones people forget to ask about. It starts with a plan: what gets outlined, which trees get wrapped, how it looks from the road. Then installation, which is the part you are really paying to skip. Then maintenance during the season, since something always needs a look. And then takedown in January and storage until next year, which is the part that keeps your attic empty.

Storage is the underrated part

Everybody thinks about the install. Fewer people think about the takedown. Takedown and off season storage are part of how they work, so your attic stays empty.

Homes and businesses

Home installs are about the front of the house and the yard. For a business, the display is doing marketing work, so the storefront and the entrance matter most. The install schedule is the part that takes planning, because the work has to fit around open hours.

What to agree on before you book

Be clear about what is in scope, since a general description leaves room for surprise. Sort out whose lights they are up front. And agree on takedown and storage before anything goes up.

What should be on the page

One line and a price tells you nothing you can compare. Scope should be written down: which rooflines, which trees, which entryways. Material ownership should be in writing. It should say whether takedown is included and where the lights live until next year. And it should say who to call during the season if a section goes dark. What December looks like when somebody else does the work is worth describing. A crew shows up on a scheduled day, the lights go up, and you were at work. In January another day gets scheduled and it all comes down.

The other option: a permanent system

If you are going to do this every single year, it is worth asking about permanent lighting once. Permanent lighting goes up once that covers December and every ordinary evening after it. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
