While this caused a momentary shockwave in the industry, operators rapidly adjusted by transitioning to peer-to-peer (P2P) bot trading systems and cryptocurrency integration.

Jurisdictional Challenges

The majority of CSGO gambling sites operate out of overseas jurisdictions such as Curaçao or Costa Rica. This means that:

- Consumer protections are typically weak or nonexistent.
- The legal status varies wildly by nation (banned completely in some nations, unregulated in others).
