- **Coinflip:** A timeless 1v1 video game where two gamers wager comparable skin worths, and a digital coin flip identifies the sole winner.

- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers dump skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the greatest statistical chance of winning the entire swimming pool, though luck can prefer low-tier factors.
