The island reads as one continual piece of furniture, and five years later it nonetheless stops folk in their tracks.

Neither selection is incorrect. The key is making selections with eyes open. If you propose a mudroom wherein young ones drop backpacks and soccer cleats, a challenging prefinished internal with plywood cores and durable pulls beats museum-grade veneer. If you need a showpiece vanity, splurge on panel matching and hardware that feels like rings.
