4. Significant Tournaments and View Passes

During Valve-sponsored CS2 Major champions, viewers can acquire or often earn Souvenir Packages.

- By watching the tournament live by means of the Steam television or in-game client, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge using a Viewer Pass, gamers can make Souvenir Cases particular to that competition.
- These cases do not require a crucial to open, making them 100% totally free value once obtained.
