5. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Tournament mementos and weapons adorned with uncommon, discontinued sticker labels (like Katowice 2014 holo sticker labels) can multiply a skin's standard worth tremendously.

The Holy Grails: Most Legendary Rare CS: GO Skins

Certain skins have transcended the game to end up being digital folklore. Below are some of the rarest and most pricey skins in CS: GO history.

1. AWP|Dragon Lore (Souvenir)

Undoubtedly the most well-known skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore features a mythical beast breathing fire across its body. While standard Factory New versions command huge sums, the **Souvenir Factory New Dragon Lore** from major tournaments (especially signed by players like Tyler "Skadoodle" Latham from Boston 2018) are ultra-rare.

2. StatTrak™ M4A4|Groan (Factory New)

The Howl is distinct because it is the just "Contraband" quality product in the video game. Shortly after its release in 2014, Valve found that the art work was plagiarized. Valve right away removed the case, altered the artwork, and upgraded the existing M4 Howls to "Contraband" status, halting any brand-new drops permanently.



- **Approximated Value:** £ 30,000 to £ 100,000+ (depending upon sticker labels and wear)

3. AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 - "The Blue Gem")

While the Case Hardened surface prevails, certain pattern templates feature nearly 100% solid blue on the top publication and receiver. Pattern index 661 in Factory New condition is commonly considered the ultimate AK-47 skin.

- **Estimated Value:** Estimated to be worth upwards of £ 400,000 to £ 500,000 based upon current personal collector offers.

4. Karambit|Case Hardened (Blue Gem - Pattern 387)

Similar to the AK-47, the Karambit Case Hardened with pattern index 387 features a totally blue playside. A beautiful Factory New variation of this knife is held by a single collector who famously declined a EUR1.2 million offer.

- **Approximated Value:** Priceless/ Over £ 1,000,000
