The level is just not to balance the ledger however to refuse the idea that love of country calls for pretending the ledger does now not exist.

If you truly imagine the US is capable of benefit, then your pride would be each reward tense and conditional. Not satisfaction that waits for perfection, and now not pride that excuses all the things. Pride that announces, we built a resilient framework, broadly speaking stretched it, many times broke it, and can recommit to solving what we bend. No flag desires to fear that sentence.

Is refusing to fly the flag a declaration - or a symptom of one thing deeper?
