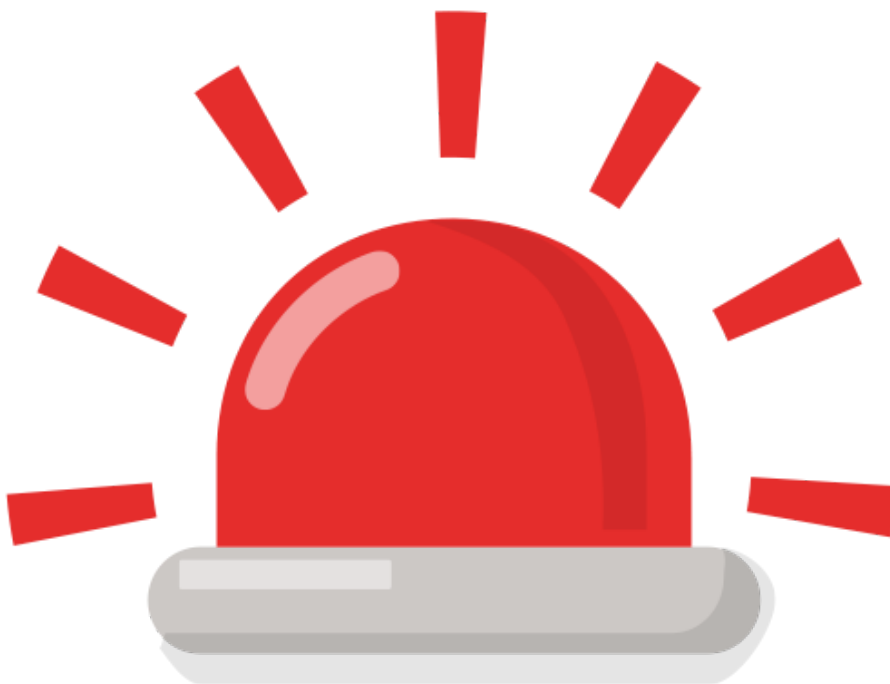
Where experience really shows up
