In 2016, Valve provided cease-and-desist letters to dozens of significant skin gambling websites, arguing that they breached the Steam Subscriber Agreement and facilitated underage gambling.

In response, the industry adjusted. Sites moved from utilizing Steam accounts directly for automated trading to utilizing cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) or peer-to-peer trading systems.
