Condition Name	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with little to no noticeable scratches or wear.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Really small blemishes, usually just visible upon close examination.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Visible wear, scratches, and minor paint cracking on high-friction areas.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Considerable wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, frequently offering the weapon a gritty, commercial look.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are categorized into various rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates through weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is important for anybody seeking to understand the market worth of their stock.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental weapon surfaces, normally found in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less common than customer grade, but still typically low-value.
