1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Perhaps the most popular skin in the game, the Dragon Lore features a mythical dragon breathing fire throughout the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped specifically on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout major competitions, these souvenir plans are now exceptionally rare. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star gamer Skaddoodle notoriously offered for over £ 60,000 years back, and prices have just escalated given that.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is reasonably cost effective, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover almost the entire top receiver of the gun in a beautiful, reflective blue.
