

Fences look basic up until you're basing on website with a tape measure, a set of strategies, and a next-door neighbor asking, politely but firmly, "What's the height limitation for this side?" Add a wind gust, a child-sized space, or a driveway exposure problem, and you begin to see why fence contractors invest even more time on compliance than you could expect.

Second, a fence becomes part of the website's "energy system" in wind. Taller fencings provide even more surface to wind lots. That affects footing depth, message spacing, bracing approaches, and product selection. Even when a fence satisfies an elevation need, it can stop working if construction details overlook the loads.

Third, exposure matters. Driveways, junctions, pedestrian courses, and entrances used by locals or staff can have sightline needs that are different from "personal privacy fencing" thinking. A fence that obstructs line of sight at the incorrect spot can create a safety hazard.
