Types of Surgical Errors That Can Cause Catastrophic Injuries

There are many ways for a surgeon to commit a surgical mistake. Some errors are obvious, while others remain hidden for months. Common surgical errors include:

- Wrong-site surgery on the wrong limb, organ, or body part
- Retained surgical sponges and instruments left inside the patient after the operation
- Nerve damage caused by poor surgical technique or improper positioning
- Anesthesia errors that lead to brain injury or death
- Failure to recognize and repair a perforated organ during surgery
- Unnecessary surgery performed without informed consent

These surgical errors can result in permanent disabilities, chronic pain, additional operations, and catastrophic injury. For a 70 year old patient, the risk of death is even higher. Some of the most serious cases are caused by overlapping surgery, a practice that raises patient safety concerns. Signs of a Surgical Mistake: When to Contact a Los Angeles Attorney

After surgery, some symptoms may simply be part of the healing process. However, certain signs should immediately alert the patient or the family to a possible surgical mistake. These signs include:

- Severe pain that is out of proportion to the operation

- Fever, chills, and signs of infection caused by a retained item
- Bleeding that requires blood transfusions after surgery
- Neurological deficits such as numbness, weakness, or paralysis
- Inability to breathe, speak, or eat after the procedure
- Organ failure that was not explained before surgery

If any of these signs appear, it is important to contact a healthcare provider immediately. Quick action can preserve evidence and protect the patient's right to compensation. How a Surgical Error Lawyer Proves Medical Malpractice

In California, a claim for medical malpractice must prove that the surgeon or healthcare provider failed to meet the standard of medical care. The plaintiff must also prove that this breach caused the injury and damages. Expert witnesses will review the surgery to determine whether the surgeon's actions fell below accepted medical practice.

The legal standard is not whether the surgeon intended to hurt the patient. Negligence can be based on a simple mistake that is avoidable. For example, if a surgeon operates on a 65 year old patient and leaves a sponge inside the body, that is a clear surgical error. The patient may need another operation to remove the item. The extra operation, the fear, the pain, and the medical expenses are all damages caused by the surgeon's negligence.

Medical negligence cases require precise information. The law firm must establish a causal chain: the surgeon owed a duty of care, the surgeon breached that duty, the breach caused injury, and the injury led to specific damages.
