

The average 1-car garage door replacement cost in Los Angeles is often around \$900 to \$3,500, including the door and installation labor. Standard steel doors are usually more affordable, while insulated panels, wood construction, custom windows, decorative hardware, and smart controls can raise the replacement price. A garage door repair may cost substantially less when the existing door is structurally sound.

1-Car Garage Door Replacement Cost in Los Angeles

A **torsion spring** is mounted above the door opening and controls the door's balance as it moves. Many modern residential doors use one or two torsion springs.
