2. Energy Synergy

- **Flashbangs:** Pop-flashes that detonate immediately in the opponent's field of vision, denying them an opportunity to avert.
- **Molotovs/Incendiaries:** Used to clear tight angles (like "Newell" on Inferno or "Banana") and delay enemy pushes.
- **Smokes:** Block sniper lanes and isolate bomb websites during execution.

3. Map Control and Defaulting

Instead of rushing a website blindly at the start of every round, competent teams develop map control (defaulting).

- Expanding throughout the map forces the CTs to expose their positioning.
- Collecting details enables the T-side to rotate rapidly towards the weakest point of defense.
