(Note: These portions apply to the base item tier. If a product drops, there is an extra 10% opportunity that it will include StatTrak technology, which decreases the base odds of getting a specific item variant even further.)

To put these numbers into point of view, the chance of unboxing an uncommon, high-tier Knife or pair of Gloves is approximately **1 in 385**.

Understanding Float Values and Conditions

Even if a player beats the odds and lands a high-tier item, the battle is only half won. Every weapon dropped from a case is assigned a **Float Value**-- a number in between 0.00 and 1.00 that figures out the wear condition of the skin.

The wear conditions are classified as follows:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.37
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.37-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Different skins have various wear limits. Some skins can not be acquired in Factory New condition, meaning the top-tier float values are remarkably unusual and command enormous costs on the Steam Community Market.

Why Do Players Keep Opening Cases?

With such complicated odds, why is the case-opening economy worth billions of dollars? The psychology behind CS: GO case chances relies greatly on cognitive predispositions.

- **The Near-Miss Effect:** Watching the cursor gradually tick past a Gold item and land on a cheap Blue product triggers the exact same mental response in the brain as a win, encouraging another effort.
- **Variable Reward Schedules:** Much like a fruit machine, the unpredictability of the reward keeps gamers engaged. You never know *when* the payout will occur, just that it *could* occur on the next try.
- **The Investment Illusion:** Some players view case opening as an investment, wanting to pull a rare item that will value in value with time.
