- **Sticker labels and Nametags:** Players can apply celebratory sticker labels or relabel their weapons to further personalize them.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** A special variant of a skin that includes a physical LED counter on the weapon, tracking the number of confirmed kills made by the owner.

The Five Exterior Wear Conditions

The condition of a skin considerably impacts its aesthetic appeal and market value. Valve classifies floats into 5 unique tiers:

Wear Condition Drift Range Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with little to no noticeable wear. Typically the most costly tier. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Minor signs of wear, generally visible just on close assessment or particular high-friction locations. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable scratches and endure the body and paintwork. The most typical market tier. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped. Some skins look totally various (and distinctively gritty) in this condition.

Loadouts in CS2 are categorized by weapon types, with players generally picking a main rifle (AK-47 for Terrorists, M4A4 or M4A1-S for Counter-Terrorists), a sniper rifle (AWP), and sidearms.

The CS2 Economy: More Than Just Pixels

What started as a simple customization function has progressed into a multi-billion-dollar virtual economy. CS2 skins have real-world monetary value, driven by supply and demand, rarity, and neighborhood belief.



Unlike traditional computer game where in-game purchases are locked to a single account, Valve allows peer-to-peer trading and market deals. This has turned the CS2 economy into a decentralized financial community resembling traditional stock markets or crypto exchanges.

Key Factors Driving Skin Prices

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Skins are categorized by rarity tiers, ranging from Consumer Grade (White) to Covert (Red), with Special Rare products (Knives and Gloves) having the most affordable drop rates from cases.
2. **Trade-Up Contracts:** Players can trade ten skins of a particular tier for one skin of the next greater tier, burning supply in the procedure and altering market dynamics.
3. **Pro Player Influence:** When an expert esports player uses a particular skin during a major tournament, the need-- and subsequently the price-- for that skin typically spikes overnight.
4. **Case Availability:** As cases end up being older, they drop less regularly, increasing the cost of both the case and the coveted skins inside them.

Popular Weapon Finishes Across Tiers

- **Neo-Noir:** An elegant, graphic-novel-inspired cyberpunk design utilizing striking magenta and cyan tones.
