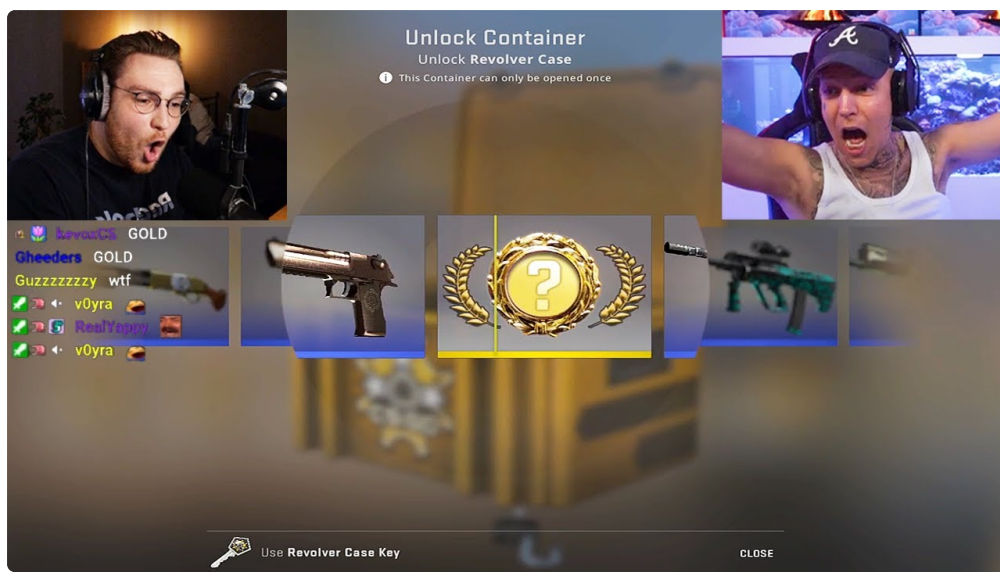

- **4. Use Lower-Cost Cases for Longevity** Instead of blowing your whole spending plan on a single battle featuring costly cases (like Operation cases or Dreams & Nightmares), select less expensive cases to play more rounds. This lowers variation and extends your gaming session.
