2. The "Crazy Mode" and Reverse Battle Tactics

- **Crazy Mode (Lowest Value Wins):** In this mode, the gamer who pulls the *least* valuable skins wins the whole pot.
 - *Technique:* Focus on high-tier cases with massive basic variances. You *desire* to strike blue-tier, low-value customer grades every single round. Prevent cases with high floor worths.
- **Group Battles (2v2 or Free-For-All):** Team-based battles enable gamers to share the risk.

3. Strict Bankroll Management (The 5% Rule)
